

Rogério Zandamela Governor of the Banco de Moçambique

Born in Inhambane, 1957. The Governor holds a Ph.D. in Economics from Johns Hopkins University (1987), and completed a postgraduate degree in Development Economics at Université Paris II (1983), following a bachelor's degree in Economics and Trade at Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore (1981).

In 2006, he taught economics at Eastern Michigan University in the United States, as an Assistant Professor.

In 1988, he joined the International Monetary Fund, and successively held the position of Resident Representative in Brazil and as Chief of Mission for Armenia, Costa Rica, Gambia, Guatemala, Liberia, Malaysia, Nicaragua, Peru, Trinidad and Tobago and Zimbabwe, in the Money and Capital Markets Department. Moreover, he also held the office of Chief of Mission for Djibouti and Somalia at the Middle East and Central Asia Department.

In August 2016, he was appointed Governor of the Banco de Moçambique, and is currently serving a second term.
