

## Jamal Luís Omar Board Member at the Banco de Moçambique

Born in Zambézia, 1971. He holds a master's degree in Development Economics (2009) and a bachelor's degree in Economics (1996) from Eduardo Mondlane University.

He was appointed Board Member for Monetary Stability at the Banco de Moçambique in 2019, and held the office from 2020 to 2022. He is currently responsible for Administrative Services and Property.

Prior to his appointment in 2017, he served as Advisor to the Governor of the Banco de Moçambique. In the following year, he was appointed Director of the International Relations and Protocol Department.

From 2011 to 2017, he held the position of Assistant Director of the Economic Investigation Division of the Economic Research Department.

He joined the Banco de Moçambique in 1998, and was posted at the Economic Research Department.

From 2008 to 2010, he was a Non-Executive Board Member for Markets at the Cooperativa de Poupança e Crédito (Credit and Savings Cooperative).

From 2010 to 2011, he was a special appointee at the International Monetary Fund, as the Economist responsible for the External Sector of the São Tomé and Príncipe team. He participated in Program and Article IV missions to São Tomé and Príncipe and the Republic of Congo.

Prior to joining the Banco de Moçambique, he worked as a Project Analyst and Advisor to the Director-General at the Sociedade de Fomento Pesqueiro (Fishing Promotion Company) from 1996 to 1998.

He boasts teaching experience, having taught Monetary Economics from 2021 to 2014, for the master's course in Development Economics at Eduardo Mondlane University.
